President's Report Dr. Neupauer reported on the following:

College Activities

-An open house was held on the Main Campus on April 12. There were 400

visitors and 180 applications for admission submitted.

-Associate Professor Sherri Mack received a Teaching Excellence Award by the Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs. She will be recognized

in Anaheim in June.

-There are currently 86 students enrolled in our Degree Completion Program.

-The Boy Scouts Technology Program was held on the Main Campus on April 1.

-Vice President for Academic Affairs interviews will be held on the Main Campus

on May 2 & 3.

-Our Rho Phi Chapter of PTK was recently awarded a 5-Star Middle States Distinguished Chapter. We held our spring induction on the Main Campus on

March 22.

- -Butler Business Recognition selected the Heaton Family Learning Commons as the 2017 Best of Butler Award for Libraries.
- -Dr. Willoughby was named a Diamond Honoree by Educational Leadership Foundation of ACPA: College Student Educators' International.

State and Federal Activities

-The annual meeting of the PA Commission for Community Colleges and Lobby Day were held in Harrisburg on April 2-4. Commissioner Geyer and Mr. Kubit attended. A joint meeting with students and staff from CCBC was held with approximately 10 local legislators. Mr. Kubit gave an outstanding speech at the Lobby Day event on behalf of all PA community college trustees. BC3 students Lauren Denny and Tarah Schmidt were named Bronze All-PA Academic Scholars.

Executive

Mr. Steffler reported the committee met via conference call on March 29, 2017, to approve an application for state assistance for construction of community college facilities as related to renovation of BC3@Cranberry. Resolution 17-06 Award of General Construction Bid for the Children's Creative Learning Center

Mr. Miller moved to award the base bid of \$1,299,000, Alternate #1 for \$16,900, Alternate #5 for \$24,000 to Dimarco Construction of Clairton, PA. Dimarco Construction submitted the lowest responsible bid of \$1,339,900 for the project. Motion Carried.

Resolution 17-07 Award of Plumbing Construction Bid for the Children's Creative Learning Center

Mr. McCafferty moved to award the bid of \$51,400 and Alternate #1 for \$2,100 to Advanced Plumbing & Mechanical of Aliquippa, PA. Advanced Plumbing & Mechanical submitted the lowest responsible bid in the amount of \$53,500 for the project. Motion Carried.

Resolution 17-08 Award of Fire Protection Construction Bid for the Children's **Creative Learning Center**

Mr. Newcaster moved to award the bid of \$283,200 to Penn-Ohio Electric of Masury, OH. Penn-Ohio Electric submitted the lowest responsible bid for the project. Motion Carried.

Academic Assessment Ms. Hawkins reported the committee met this morning with faculty and deans to discuss the five-year Program Evaluation and Improvement review process of the Accounting, Computer-Aided Machining Technology and Manufacturing with Advanced Technology programs. Dr. Russell noted the new program review process was developed from a Middle States recommendation, identifying strengths and areas for improvement in each program. The committee recommends the continuation of each program.

Quality Assessment

Mr. Scotece reported the committee met on March 30, to discuss the upcoming Middle States Small Team visit. He said it is a viable process and we are ready for the visit. The committee also discussed the 2017-2022 Strategic Plan.

Foundation

Ruth Purcell reported the following:

-A report on the Foundation's role at BC3@LindenPointe notes since 2010, the Foundation has acquired \$622,909 in unrestricted funds from rental to support BC3. Foundation expenditures for property upkeep has been less than \$25,000 since 2010.

-XTO Energy made a gift of \$25,000 to support the BC3 FabLab.

-The BC3 scholarship application went live on the College website on April 17. Students have until July 1, to apply.

-The Foundation is working with the Leadership Butler County class project to fund a scholarship to BC3 for Butler County students who participate in the Youth Leadership Butler County program. Each of the 30 students participating will receive a \$500 scholarship.

Alumni Council

Mr. Miller reported the Alumni Council is celebrating their 20th anniversary with a special event with Dr. Neupauer on May 4, from 6:00-8:00 p.m. in the Heaton Family Learning Commons. Invitations to more than 250 local alumni are being mailed.
