Local, State and Federal Activities

-The state budget is expected to include a five percent increase for community colleges. The presidents are hoping to get at least that amount and possibly up

to seven-and one-half percent.

-The annual all-trustee meeting hosted by the PA Commission for Community Colleges is scheduled for Thursday, November 17, from 6:00-7:30 p.m. An opportunity to meet the candidates is included in the agenda. This will be a

virtual meeting.
College Activities

-Approximately half of the estate of Tim Shaffer is bequeathed to BC3. His scholarship in memory of his brother will receive some of the funds and his parents will be honored with the creation of a new scholarship.

-The Foundation continues to receive gifts for the Victor K. Phillips Nursing and Allied Health Building. We are working with Senator Pittman for additional state

funding for BC3 @ Armstrong as well.

- -We are working with Penn Highlands Healthcare in DuBois to offer a nursing program. A Memorandum of Understanding was created to enter into an agreement similar to that of Concordia. Penn Highlands Healthcare will provide \$300,000 for operating use.
- -The May 18, Commencement ceremony was a very successful event.
- -A Celebration of Life honoring Jean Purvis was held in Founders Hall on June 8. It was a very nice event.
- -Congratulations to coach Bill Miller and the BC3 golf team. They finished the season ranked sixth in the NJCAA.
